North Central District Health Department regrettably announces the third death in Shelby County due to complications from the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19). Two additional lab-confirmed cases in Shelby County and one new case in Spencer County increasing the district case count to 45. Three individuals monitored by North Central District have been released from isolation.

Shelby County, KY – Shelby has had its third COVID-19 related death in an adult male with underlying medical conditions, our hearts and prayers go out to his family and friends.

Two patients from Shelby County have tested positive for the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19); both adult males are currently in self-isolation at home. One pediatric female from Spencer County is in self-isolation at home.

North Central District has released two Shelby County and one Henry County patients from isolation. All three individuals have been released from isolation by monitoring their symptoms and complying with a self-isolation agreement with the Health Department.

“Some people may confuse isolation with quarantine. Those who are in isolation are sick and infectious and should separate themselves from those who are not sick to include members in their household. Those who are in quarantine have been exposed to someone who is sick and need to separate themselves from others, so they do not infect others if they become sick.”, said Roanya Rice, Public Health Director of NCDHD
