North Central District Health Department is reporting forty-one new lab-confirmed cases in Shelby, Henry, Spencer, and Trimble Counties increasing the district case count to 878.

Shelby County, KY – North Central District Health Department has forty-one cases that tested positive for the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19).

- **Shelby County= 27**
 - 6 adult Caucasian males in self-isolation at home.

 - 8 adult Caucasian females in self-isolation at home.
 - 2 pediatric Caucasian males in self-isolation at home.
 - 3 pediatric Hispanic females in self-isolation at home.
 - 1 Pediatric Hispanic male in self-isolation at home.
 - 1 African American male in self-isolation at home.
 - 2 adult Hispanic males in self-isolation at home.
 - 2 adult Caucasian females at the Kentucky Correctional Institute for Women.
