North Central District Health Department regretfully announces one new death in Shelby County due to complications from the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19). Thirty-five new lab-confirmed cases in Shelby, Henry, Spencer, and Trimble Counties increasing the district case count to 913. Thirty-eight individuals monitored by North Central District have been released from isolation.

Shelby County, KY – Shelby has had one new COVID-19 related death in an elderly male with underlying medical conditions; our hearts and prayers go out to his family and friends.

North Central District Health Department has thirty-five cases that tested positive for the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19).

- **Henry County = 1**
 - 1 adult Caucasian female in self-isolation at home.
- **Spencer County = 1**
 - 1 adult Caucasian female in self-isolation at home.
- **Trimble County = 1**
 - 1 adult Caucasian female in self-isolation at home.
- **Shelby County= 32**
 - 3 adult Caucasian males in self-isolation at home.
 - 2 adult Hispanic males in self-isolation at home.
 - 1 adult Caucasian female in self-isolation at home.
 - 26 females, unknown race/ethnicity at the Kentucky Correctional Institute for Women.

North Central District released thirty-eight individuals from isolation from nineteen from Shelby County, six from Spencer County, four from Trimble County and nine from Henry County who monitored their symptoms and complied with a self-isolation agreement with the Health Department.
