North Central District Health Department is reporting thirty-four new lab-confirmed cases in Shelby, Henry, and Spencer Counties increasing the district case count to 947. Seventy-eight individuals monitored by North Central District have been released from isolation.

Shelby County, KY – North Central District Health Department has thirty-four cases that tested positive for the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19).

- **Henry County = 5**
 - 3 adult Caucasian females in self-isolation at home.
 - 1 adult Caucasian male in self-isolation at home.
 - 1 adult African American male in self-isolation at home.

- **Spencer County = 9**
 - 6 adult Caucasian males in self-isolation at home.
 - 2 adult Caucasian female in self-isolation at home.
 - 1 adult Caucasian male under medical care.

- **Shelby County= 20**
 - 7 adult Caucasian males in self-isolation at home.
 - 2 adult Hispanic males in self-isolation at home.
 - 9 adult Caucasian females in self-isolation at home.
 - 1 adult Caucasian male under medical care.
 - 1 adult African American in self-isolation at home.

North Central District released seventy-eight individuals from isolation from sixty-five from Shelby County, five from Spencer County, three from Trimble County and five from Henry County who monitored their symptoms and complied with a self-isolation agreement with the Health Department.
