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**North Central District Health Department is reporting one hundred-ninety-nine new lab-confirmed cases in Shelby, Henry, Trimble, and Spencer Counties, increasing the district case count to 4276. One hundred-thirty-one individuals monitored by North Central District have been released from isolation.**

**Shelby County, KY** – North Central District Health Department has one hundred-ninety-nine cases that tested positive for the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19).

North Central District released one hundred-thirty-one individuals from isolation; seventy-two from Shelby County, thirty-six from Spencer County, and twenty-three from Henry County monitored their symptoms and complied with a self-isolation agreement with the Health Department.
