North Central District Health Department regretfully announces four deaths, two from Spencer County and one from Trimble County due to complications from the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19). One hundred-sixty-three new lab-confirmed cases in Shelby, Henry, Trimble, and Spencer Counties, increasing the district case count to 4077. One hundred-fifty-nine individuals monitored by North Central District have been released from isolation.

North Central District released one hundred-fifty-nine individuals from isolation; ninety-four from Shelby County, forty-three from Spencer County, and twenty-two from Henry County monitored their symptoms and complied with a self-isolation agreement with the Health Department.

“Health officials are predicting a spike in Covid-19 cases, due to the lack of recommended compliance during the Thanksgiving holiday. With the upcoming Christmas, Hanukkah, and Kwanzaa holidays, the community needs to take action to prevent the further spread of this virus by masking up, maintain social distance, and getting tested to identify those who need to self-isolate to protect the community health at large. It is also important to not have large and small group gatherings. NCDHD is standing ready to start pushing out the COVID vaccine to those who qualify in Tier 1 once the vaccine is available. It will be incredibly important for the community, at large, to get the COVID vaccine once they qualify and it is available.”, said Roanya Rice, Public Health Director of NCDHD.
