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**North Central District Health Department regretfully is announcing another death in Spencer County due to complications from the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19). Sixty-four new lab-confirmed cases in Shelby, Henry, Trimble, and Spencer Counties, increasing the district case count to 7,201. One hundred fifty-eight monitored by North Central District have been released from isolation.**

**Shelby County, KY** – Spencer County has had another COVID-19 related death in an elderly Caucasian female with underlying conditions; our hearts and prayers go out to her family and friends.

North Central District Health Department has sixty-four cases that tested positive for the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19).

- **Shelby County = 24**
  - 10 adult Caucasian females in self-isolation at home.
  - 7 adult Caucasian males in self-isolation at home.
  - 3 pediatric Caucasian males in self-isolation at home.
  - 2 adult Hispanic males in self-isolation at home.
  - 1 pediatric Hispanic female in self-isolation at home.
  - 1 adult African American male in self-isolation at home.
- **Henry County= 16**
  - 7 adult Caucasian females in self-isolation at home.
  - 4 adult Caucasian males in self-isolation at home.
  - 2 elderly Caucasian males in self-isolation at home.
  - 3 pediatric Caucasian males in self-isolation at home.
- **Spencer County= 18**
  - 8 adult Caucasian females in self-isolation at home.
  - 5 adult Caucasian males in self-isolation at home.
  - 1 elderly Caucasian female in self-isolation at home.
  - 4 pediatric Caucasian females in self-isolation at home.
- **Trimble County= 6**
  - 2 adult Caucasian females in self-isolation at home.
  - 2 adult Caucasian males in self-isolation at home.
  - 1 elderly Caucasian male in self-isolation at home.
  - 1 pediatric Caucasian female in self-isolation at home.

North Central District released one hundred fifty-eight individuals from isolation; seventy-nine from Shelby County, forty-one from Spencer County, thirty-one from Henry County and seven from Trimble County monitored their symptoms and complied with a self-isolation agreement with the Health Department.

*“North Central District Health Department is providing primary (1st) Covid-19 vaccine doses over the next few weeks; an online self-scheduler is loaded on our website with available appointments to select. To be eligible to schedule an appointment, you must be in Phase 1a and 1b and live or work in one of the four counties in our district. You must register in the County tab for which you live. Identification will be required at the vaccine clinics. Each week we will load additional appointments as vaccine supply allows. Monitor our website at [NCDHD.com](http://NCDHD.com) daily for updates. North Central District Health Department has transitioned to a District approach with the vaccine clinic site location. Our vaccination clinics will be centrally located in Shelbyville, KY. Using a centrally located facility will allow NCDHD to administer vaccine more quickly, be more efficient, serve more community members within the targeted phases and eliminate the need to transfer the vaccine to remote locations. If there is a clinic schedule on a day that we have inclement weather, please check our website, social media, and local news channels for vaccine clinic delays or cancelations. “, said Roanya Rice, Public Health Director of NCDHD.*
