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North Central District Health Department regretfully is announcing another death in Shelby County due to complications from the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19). Eighty-two new lab-confirmed cases in Shelby, Henry, Trimble, and Spencer Counties, increasing the district case count to 7,283. Ninety-five monitored by North Central District have been released from isolation.

Shelby County, KY – Shelby County has had another COVID-19 related death in an elderly Caucasian male with underlying conditions; our hearts and prayers go out to his family and friends.

North Central District Health Department has eighty-two cases that tested positive for the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19).

 - 2 adult Asian males in self-isolation at home.
 - 1 adult African American male in self-isolation at home.
- **Spencer County= 12**
 - 5 adult Caucasian females in self-isolation at home.
 - 6 adult Caucasian males in self-isolation at home.
 - 1 elderly Caucasian female in self-isolation at home.
- **Trimble County= 7**
 - 3 adult Caucasian females in self-isolation at home.
 - 2 adult Caucasian males in self-isolation at home.
 - 1 elderly Caucasian female in self-isolation at home.
 - 1 pediatric Caucasian female in self-isolation at home.



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North Central District released ninety-five individuals from isolation; fifty-seven from Shelby County, nineteen from Spencer County, twelve from Henry County and seven from Trimble County monitored their symptoms and complied with a self-isolation agreement with the Health Department.

“North Central District Health Department has rescheduled a few Covid-19 vaccination clinics to alternate days, due to winter weather storms. We understand the importance of everyone wanting to receive the Covid vaccination as soon as possible, but we want to provide a safe environment for community members and staff to attend.

- Prime dose (1st) Covid vaccination clinics on Monday (2/15/2021) and Monday (2/22/2021) has been moved to Saturday (2/20/2021).
- Booster dose (2nd) Covid vaccination clinics scheduled for Tuesday (2/16/2021) and Wednesday (2/17/2021) has been rescheduled to Monday (2/22/2021).

According to the CDC the window to receive the booster dose of vaccine may be extended beyond the 28-day waiting period if necessary, if the second dose is not administered within 6 weeks of the first does, the series does not need to be restarted. “, said Roanya Rice, Public Health Director of NCDHD.
