North Central District Health Department regretfully announces a new death from Shelby County due to complications from the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19). Seventy-eight new lab-confirmed cases in Shelby, Henry, Trimble, and Spencer Counties, increasing the district case count to 6902. One hundred thirty-six individuals monitored by North Central District have been released from isolation.

Shelby County, KY – Shelby County has had another COVID-19 related death in an elderly African American male with pre-existing underlying conditions; our hearts and prayers go out to his family and friends.

North Central District Health Department has seventy-eight cases that tested positive for the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19).

 - 2 pediatric Caucasian males in self-isolation at home.
- **Trimble County= 10**
 - 3 adult Caucasian females in self-isolation at home.
 - 2 adult Caucasian males in self-isolation at home.

North Central District released one hundred thirty-six individuals from isolation; fifty-nine from Shelby County, twenty-three from Spencer County, thirty-seven from Henry County and seventeen from Trimble County monitored their symptoms and complied with a self-isolation agreement with the Health Department.
