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North Central District Health Department is reporting one hundred fifty-eight new lab-confirmed cases in Shelby, Henry, Trimble, and Spencer Counties, increasing the district case count to 6465. One hundred thirteen individuals monitored by North Central District have been released from isolation.

Shelby County, KY – North Central District Health Department has one hundred fifty-eight cases that tested positive for the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19).

North Central District released one hundred thirteen individuals from isolation; fifty-six from Shelby County, twenty-two from Spencer County, sixteen from Henry County and nineteen from Trimble County monitored their symptoms and complied with a self-isolation agreement with the Health Department.
