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**North Central District Health Department regretfully announces a new death from Shelby County due to complications from the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19). One hundred thirty new lab-confirmed cases in Shelby, Henry, Trimble, and Spencer Counties, increasing the district case count to 6595. One hundred thirty-two individuals monitored by North Central District have been released from isolation.**

**Shelby County, KY** – Shelby County has had another COVID-19 related death in an elderly Caucasian male with pre-existing underlying conditions; our hearts and prayers go out to his family and friends.

North Central District Health Department has one hundred thirty cases that tested positive for the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19).

  - 34 adult Caucasian females in self-isolation at home.

- **Spencer County= 29**
  - 14 adult Caucasian females in self-isolation at home.

  - 3 pediatric Caucasian females in self-isolation at home.
  - 1 pediatric Caucasian male in self-isolation at home.
  - 1 adult Asian female in self-isolation at home.
- **Trimble County= 6**
  - 1 adult Caucasian female in self-isolation at home.
  - 2 adult Caucasian males in self-isolation at home.

- 1 pediatric Caucasian female in self-isolation at home.
- 1 pediatric Caucasian male in self-isolation at home.

North Central District released one hundred thirty-two individuals from isolation; eighty-three from Shelby County, twenty-five from Spencer County, twelve from Henry County and twelve from Trimble County monitored their symptoms and complied with a self-isolation agreement with the Health Department.
