North Central District Health Department regrettably announces a new death from Shelby County, and a new death from Spencer County due to complications from the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19). Eighty-five new lab-confirmed cases in Shelby, Henry, Trimble, and Spencer Counties, increasing the district case count to 5551. Eighty-eight individuals monitored by North Central District have been released from isolation.

Shelby County, KY – Shelby County has had another COVID-19 related death in an elderly Caucasian male with pre-existing underlying conditions; our hearts and prayers go out to his family and friends.

Spencer County has had another COVID-19 related death in an elderly Caucasian female with pre-existing underlying conditions; our hearts and prayers go out to her family and friends.

North Central District Health Department has eighty-five cases that tested positive for the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19).
