North Central District Health Department regretfully is announcing one death in Shelby County, one death in Spencer County, and one death in Trimble County due to complications from the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19). One hundred and nine new lab-confirmed cases in Shelby, Henry, Spencer, and Trimble Counties, increasing the district case count to 7,773. One hundred and eighty-seven monitored by North Central District have been released from isolation.

Shelby County, KY – Shelby County has had another COVID-19 related death in an elderly Caucasian female with underlying conditions; our hearts and prayers go out to her family and friends.

Spencer County has had another COVID-19 related death in an elderly Caucasian male with underlying conditions; our hearts and prayers go out to his family and friends.

Trimble County has had another COVID-19 related death in an elderly Caucasian female with underlying conditions; our hearts and prayers go out to her family and friends.

North Central District Health Department has one hundred and nine cases that tested positive for the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19).

 - 7 adult Caucasian females in self-isolation at home.
 - 9 adult Caucasian males in self-isolation at home.
 - 2 elderly Caucasian females in self-isolation at home.
 - 1 pediatric Caucasian male in self-isolation at home.
 - 2 adult Caucasian males under medical care.
 - 1 adult African American male in self-isolation at home.
 - 1 adult American Indian female in self-isolation at home.
 - 1 pediatric American Indian female in self-isolation at home.

- **Trimble County= 13**

North Central District released one hundred eighty-seven individuals from isolation; one hundred three from Shelby County, thirty-five from Spencer County, thirty-seven from Henry County and twelve from Trimble County monitored their symptoms and complied with a self-isolation agreement with the Health Department.

Fully vaccinated people will still need to continue to wear masks, practice social distancing and adhere to other prevention measures in public, and get a Covid test if experiencing Covid-19 symptoms. We encourage everyone to get vaccinated when it is their turn. Everyone has worked hard up to this point, please continue to help us get to the other side of this virus.”, Roanya Rice, Public Health Director of NCDHD.

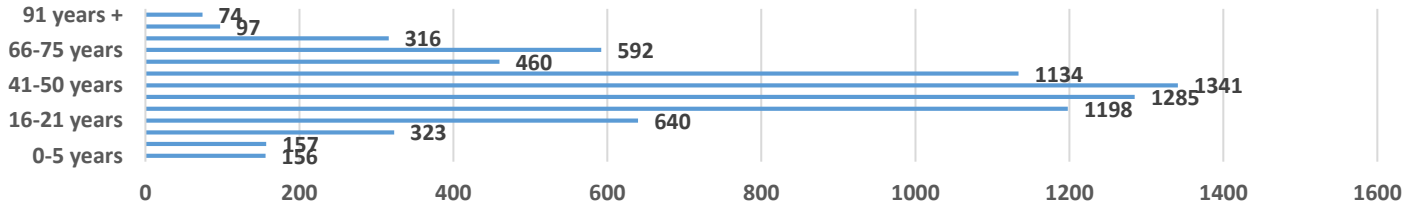

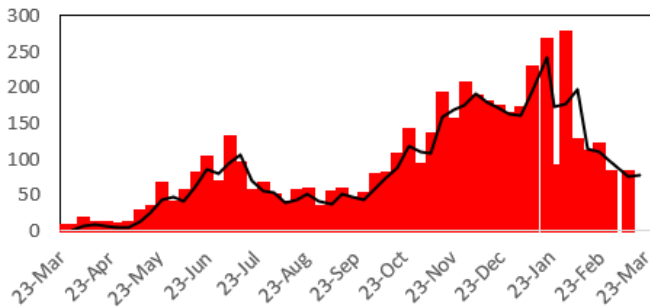

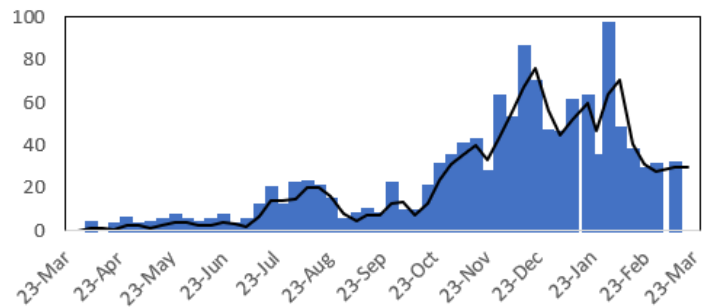
North Central District Cases by Age as of 3/12/2021



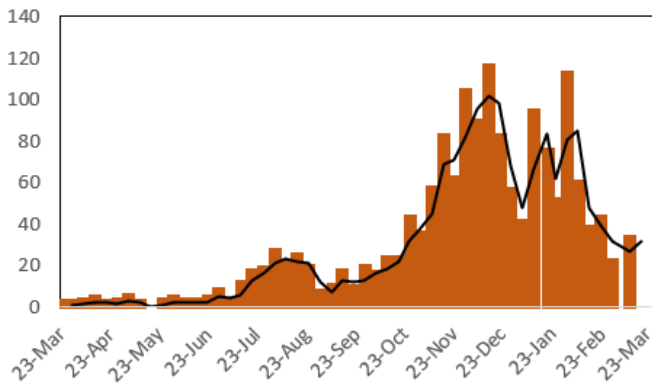
SHELBY COUNTY



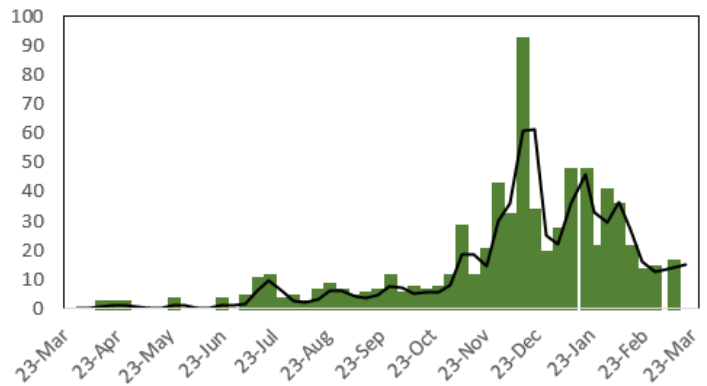
HENRY COUNTY
