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**North Central District Health Department regretfully is announcing another death in Shelby County due to complications from the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19). Twenty-seven new lab-confirmed cases in Shelby, Henry, Trimble, and Spencer Counties, increasing the district case count to 7,646. Fifty-two monitored by North Central District have been released from isolation.**

**Shelby County, KY** – Shelby County has had another COVID-19 related death in an elderly Caucasian female with underlying conditions; our hearts and prayers go out to her family and friends.

North Central District Health Department has twenty-seven cases that tested positive for the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19).

- **Shelby County = 16**
  - 8 adult Caucasian females in self-isolation at home.
  - 3 adult Caucasian males in self-isolation at home.
  - 1 elderly Caucasian female in self-isolation at home.
  - 2 pediatric Caucasian females in self-isolation at home.
  - 1 adult Hispanic male in self-isolation at home.
  - 1 pediatric Hispanic female in self-isolation at home.
  
- **Henry County= 4**
  - 2 adult Caucasian males in self-isolation at home.
  - 1 adult African American female in self-isolation at home.
  - 1 pediatric African American male in self-isolation at home.
  
- **Spencer County= 5**
  - 2 adult Caucasian females in self-isolation at home.
  - 2 adult Caucasian males in self-isolation at home.
  - 1 pediatric Caucasian male in self-isolation at home.
  
- **Trimble County= 2**
  - 1 adult Caucasian female in self-isolation at home.
  - 1 adult Caucasian male in self-isolation at home.

North Central District released fifty-two individuals from isolation; twenty-one from Shelby County, fifteen from Spencer County, twelve from Henry County and four from Trimble County monitored their symptoms and complied with a self-isolation agreement with the Health Department.
